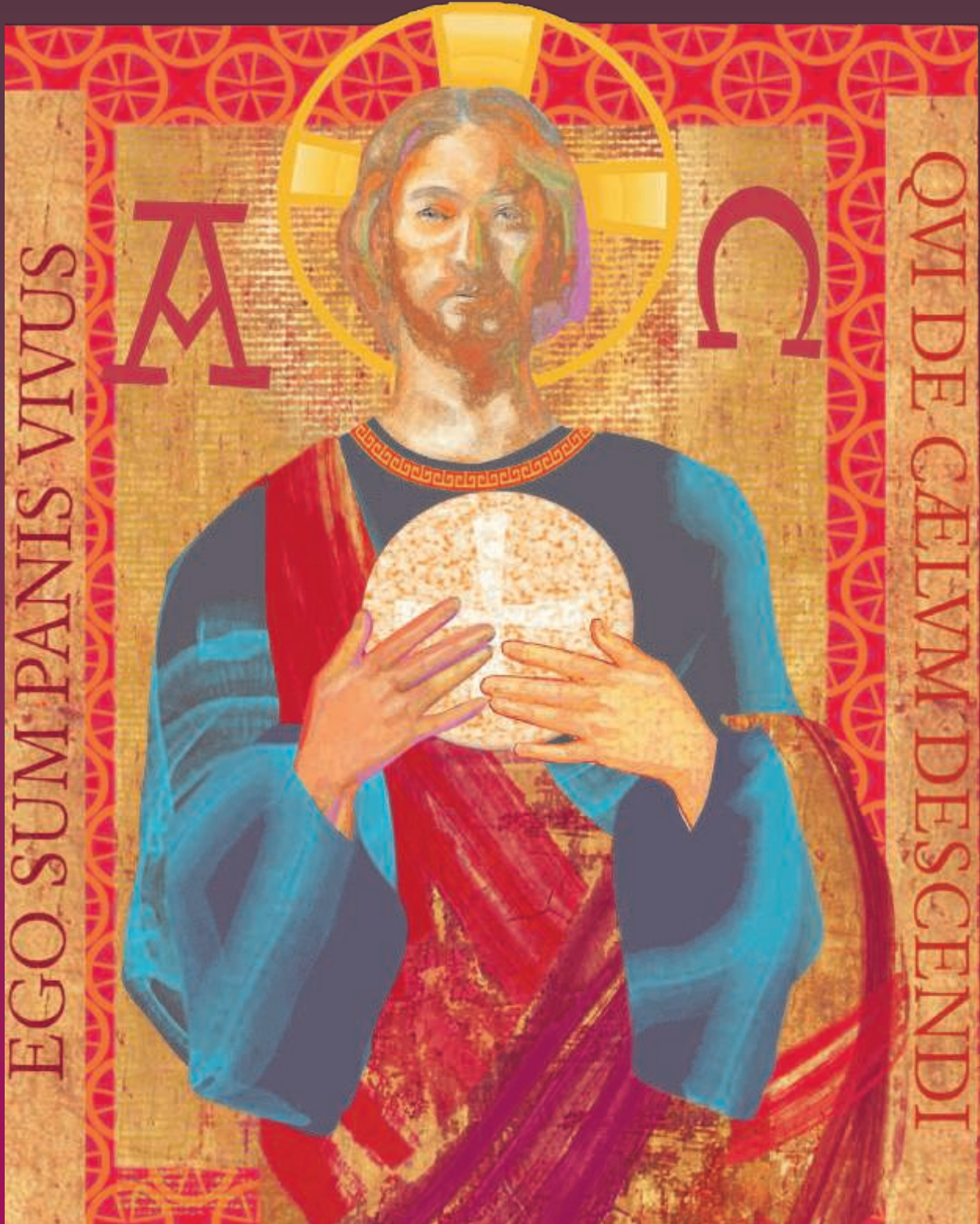

The "Little Flower" Returns to Her Chapel



Every historic building has its own story and our church building on the corner of Lexington and Summit has quite a tale to tell. When you come to Sunday Mass at the East Campus Church next weekend, you will find that our statue of Saint Therese de Lisieux has been moved to the side chapel that has held our statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In turn, the Sacred Heart of Jesus statue will be enthroned next to our Tabernacle, which houses the Blessed Sacrament. These changes have been made possible, thanks to the generous donation of an anonymous parishioner who wishes to honor the memory of those who built this magnificent house of prayer.

As the story goes, the stone workers who crafted our beautiful building chose Saint Therese as their patroness for the difficult and dangerous work they were doing. She had just been canonized by Pope Pius XI, and they prayed to her for safety. Indeed, no one was killed or injured in the building of the church and so, in gratitude, the workers dedicated the side chapel to Saint Therese de Lisieux and **gifted it to the community. In returning the "Little Flower" to her chapel, we honor the faith of those stoneworkers. With regard to the Sacred Heart of Jesus statue, this symbol of Christ's deep compassion for us, present in the Sacraments of**

Eucharist and Reconciliation, is now available to us for prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. As for the empty alcove, which once housed Saint Therese, in the future we hope to relocate our statue of Saint Thomas More to this wall, creating a devotional space to offer votive candles for personal prayers.

In these days of economic recession, the loaves and the fishes Gospel speaks to the heart of the matter: When we have run out of provisions, when our checking account is squeaking by, will God supply our need? If we believe the growth rate incurred on those five loaves and two fish, we have hope for our own reserves.

Knowing what we know about how Jesus handled a deficit, it is time for us to have a change in attitude. Could we consider trusting God with the money we need to pay our bills and keep our family fed, housed and educated? I believe the answer is a resounding yes! When we allow God to keep us, things change. What is required is the grace to give up control and power to God. We are asked to believe that God will take care of us. It is the cardinal virtue of hope at its best. This change in attitude means acting as if we have all we need. We are required to live simply and frugally and to be the best stewards we can be. Then, move forward with the firm belief that there is enough. When Jesus asks us not to worry about what we will eat or wear, he truly means it. He proved it on a hillside full of hungry people and he is more than capable of proving it to each of us.
